## Nasal Flu Vaccinations

The nasal flu vaccinations will be taking place in school on **Friday 4th December** for children from FS2 Reception through to children in Year 6.

This year, all children from the above year groups, whose parents/guardians agree, will be offered a vaccine, which is given by way of a nasal spray. This is quick and painless and is more effective in children than an injectable vaccine. The programme will be delivered by an NHS healthcare team who specialise in the delivery of school aged vaccinations. In previous years, consent forms have been in paper form and handed out to parents/carers, however, this year, consents will all be submitted online. In the next couple of weeks, the Flu Immunisation Team will be forwarding a link to us at school, which will be passed onto parents/carers in order for you to send your consents directly to the Immunisation Team. There is no need for any adults to accompany their child at school during the delivery of the vaccine.
