Our approach, rewards and promotes positive behaviour whilst supporting children in overcoming any difficulties which may arise. We support children's resilience and operate a team approach where our aim is to provide children with the skills and tools to successfully resolve conflict, understanding how the choices they have made have affected others. We promote positive language and look to find opportunities where children can succeed and have good choices in their behaviour recognised. We use the language of 'wow' and 'good' but equally we are consistent in our high expectations


What is the Nurturing Progamme?

The Building Blocks of the Nurturing Programme





What does it cover?

Over the IO-week Programme, you will look at lots of different topics, including:

understanding

why children behave as they do

Recognising

the feelings behind behaviour (ours and theirs)

Exploring

different approaches to discipline

Finding ways to develop co-operation and self-discipline in children

Learning the importance of looking after ourselves

Practical information

Partners are welcome and it's also fine to come on your own or with a relative or friend

There are ten 2-hour sessions with a tea and coffee break

8-10 parents are invited and there are two Family Links trained group leaders

you need to come to all ten sessions as they fit together like a puzzle
