Our efforts last school year, saw our overall attendance percentage move closer to the national average however we still had a number of children who missed more than 10% of their time in school. It is surprising how the odd day missing here or there can really impact on a child's education. We do understand that sometimes children become ill or have medical appointments to attend but ask for support in ensuring that if your child is well enough to attend school, that they do. Should your child have to be absent from school, please phone school before 9:00am on 01482 684082 and leave a message on the absence line. Failure to report an absence or answer a phone call from school, may result in a home visit being made. Through our safeguarding policy, we have to ensure the safety of every child every day.
