
British Science Week 6th -15th March

School Gates—Opening and closing times

To maintain a safe and secure site the gates will open and close at the following times.

Pedestrian gates

- ⇒ Eastgate opens from 8:30am, with other gates — Northholme Road then Lime Tree Avenue—being opened shortly afterwards
- ⇒ Eastgate closes at 8:45am prompt with other gates closing afterwards. Lime Tree Avenue will close almost immediately after the school doors close at 8:55am
- ⇒ Eastgate is opened at 3:10pm with other gates — Northholme Road then Lime Tree Avenue—opening shortly afterwards
- ⇒ Eastgate closes at 3:45pm with other gates closing afterwards. Lime Tree Avenue will close by 4pm
- ⇒ Outside of these times, please use the main gates to the offices from Northholme Road
