To celebrate Miss Jarvis' amazing achievements of running two marathons in one week, we are taking part in the Mini London Marathon Challenge!

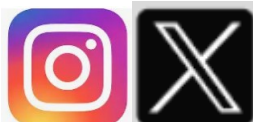
All Saints' Mini London Marathon—Mon 27 Apr - Fri 1 May

School Uniform

As we begin to welcome sunnier, warmer weather, you may wish to consider our summer school uniform. Items include:

- yellow and white or green and white gingham dresses or play suits
- grey/black formal school shorts with white or yellow polo shirts

Items from our standard school uniform can also be worn: grey or black skirts, pinafores or trousers.

Reminders

- Children should wear predominantly black school shoes or trainers. Croc-style shoes and sliders are not appropriate for school.
- Jewellery should not be worn in school, a watch and a pair of stud earrings are acceptable.
- Hair accessories should match school colours and should not distract others.
- A PE kit should be in school each day - black shorts and a white t-shirt.
