All Saints' News

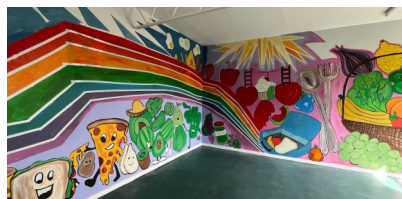

Year 6 Information Meeting

School Crossing Patrol—Update

Following the concerns I, and no doubt others, raised with the local authority regarding their decision not to replace the Crossing Patrol Officer outside the Junior entrance, after he was moved to the Infant entrance when Peter retired at the end of last year, I have received an update.

'Upon notification of retirement of the patrol at the infant entrance, an assessment of all three sites was undertaken in line with the national Road Safety GB guidelines. This assessment is known as PV2 as it is calculated using a formula as its basis, where P = number of pedestrians, and V = number of vehicles.

As a result the following actions are in place:

- Cemetery Corner – Continue with recruitment of a School Crossing Patrol
- All Saints' Federation of Academies (Infant Entrance) - School Crossing Patrol in Place
- All Saints' Federation of Academies (Junior Entrance) - Zebra crossing to be installed.

Although no specific time frame has been given for the installation [hoped to be this financial year], it is positive news that they have listened to our concerns.
